Orientation Leaders are the most significant contact new students make as they begin college. Orientation Leaders help students and families feel excited about choosing Emory & Henry. Serving as an OL is a volunteer position, but is a fun and rewarding experience, and help you develop leadership skills.

The following are some of the expectations of Orientation Leaders:

- Serve as a welcoming guide and knowledgeable source of information.
- Serve as a role model representing the college, abiding by handbook policies at all times.
- Answer questions, and lead discussions and ice breakers with students and/or families.
- Help new students with their adjustment to the Emory & Henry community.
- Prompt attendance, full preparation and participation.

Qualifications:

- Completed at least 12 credit hours, full-time student, in good social and academic standing
- Good at communicating, solving problems, and working as part of a team
- Desire to work with new students and college staff
- Knowledgeable about E&H
- Energetic, sense of humor, and positive attitude

- Make new friends, and form professional relationships with faculty and staff

- Meals on Registration Day, and rooms on campus if you are driving in from far away

- Week of Welcome Orientation: Saturday August 22-Tuesday August 25

 - Application Form
 - Résumé
 - References: Names, email and phone number of three references, at least two of which are on campus. Note that we may research social media as part of the selection process.
 - Essay Questions
- Applicants will be interviewed March 9-20. Returning Orientation Leaders do not need to interview, but may. Please be aware that past OL experience does not guarantee return placement.
- All applicants will be notified of the selection decision in writing.
- An Orientation Leader training will be scheduled in April, including signing volunteer contracts.

Note: Resident Advisors and athletes in fall sports are welcome to apply to be Orientation Leaders for the spring and summer Registration Day events.
