Orientation Leaders are the most significant contact new students make as they begin college. Orientation Leaders help students and families feel excited about choosing Emory & Henry. Serving as an OL is a volunteer position, but is a fun and rewarding experience, and help you develop leadership skills.

The following are some of the expectations of Orientation Leaders:

- Serve as a welcoming guide and knowledgeable source of information
- Serve as a role model representing the college, abiding by handbook policies at all times
- Answer questions, and lead discussions and ice breakers with students and/or families
- Help new students with their adjustment to the Emory & Henry community
- Prompt attendance, full preparation and participation

Qualifications:

- Completed at least 12 credit hours, full-time student, in good social and academic standing
- Good at communicating, solving problems, and working as part of a team
- Desire to work with new students and college staff
- Knowledgeable about E&H
- Energetic, sense of humor, and positive attitude

- Make new friends, and form professional relationships with faculty and staff
- Orientation T-shirts
- Meals on Registration Day, and rooms on campus if you are driving in from far away
- Early check-in for Week of Welcome Orientation in August (meals provided for commuters)

- New Student Registration Days: **Saturday, April 22; Friday, May 26; and Saturday, June 17**
- Transfer Student Registration Day (not required for all OLs): **Friday, July 14**
- Week of Welcome Orientation Leader Training: **Tuesday, August 15 – Friday, August 18**
- Week of Welcome Orientation: **Saturday, August 19 – Tuesday, August 22**

- Successful applications will result in an interview. Returning Orientation Leaders may be asked to interview. Please be aware that past OL experience does not guarantee return placement.
- All applicants will be notified of the selection decision in writing. (Note: We may research social media as part of the selection process.)
- An Orientation Leader training will be scheduled in early April, which will include the signing of volunteer contracts. (Note: Resident Advisors and athletes in fall sports are welcome to apply to be Orientation Leaders for the spring and summer Registration Day events.)

2. Describe your perception of an Orientation Leader and explain the responsibilities you feel are important.
3. Why are you interested in becoming an Orientation Leader? What personal characteristics will help you succeed in this position?

Returning Applicants, answer these questions:

1. Why do you want to be an Orientation Leader again this year?
2. What do you think was your best contribution to the OL program in the past?
3. What personal goals would you set if you return as an OL? Are there any new skills or opportunities you would like to pursue through serving as an Orientation Leader? Are there any particular ways you'd like to grow as a leader?
