



Greetings,

I am pleased to present the results of the Carbon Footprint Analysis for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 as part of our compliance with the American College and University Presidents' Climate Commitment (ACUPCC). This is the fourth inventory Emory & Henry has completed, and will be the third official report submitted to the ACUPCC. The results, detailed below, show our progress towards meeting our 2050 carbon neutrality goal.

In summary, our total gross emissions for the year were 8182 metric tons (7911 tons net), representing a decrease of 7.8% from 2009 (6.8% net). This reduction is equivalent to taking 71 homes off the grid for an entire year, putting us just 59 tons behind our 2012 goal. Within the overall context of ACUPCC reporting institutions, E&H's emissions on a per square foot basis are 18% better than the average emissions of peer institutions.



Our Carbon Footprint is divided into three scopes. Scope 1 is direct emissions from sources owned by the college (such as natural gas or diesel), Scope 2 is purchased electricity, and Scope 3 is indirect emissions from sources affiliated with the college, such as air travel or employee commutes.



The average for the three scopes among our peers is 24.4%, 41.6%, and 33.9% respectively. Slightly more than half (56%) of our emissions are from purchased electricity. This is mostly due to our regional grid's carbon intensity, which is approximately 25% above the national average. There were some variations in Scopes 1 and 3 as we moved to a new carbon calculator, which had some methodological differences and updated emissions factors.

We still have much work to do, but we are moving in the right direction. Our first reduction milestone, 15% by 2015, is fast approaching. As we continue to actively manage our buildings for efficiency, raise awareness on campus, and explore alternative energy sources, we hope that our footprint will continue to shrink.
