# ETLA 240 Emory Odyssey in Greece

Study the history, politics, and literature of ancient Greece on campus in the spring semester and then spend 10 days abroad in Athens, Mycenae, Corinth, Epidaurus, and Delphi exploring the ancient remains. Athens is one of the oldest and greatest cities of Western Civilization, with a recorded history that extends back 3,400 years. During the Classical period Athens was a center for the arts, learning, and philosophy. It was the home of Plato's Academy and Aristotle's Lyceum.

Visit the Acropolis at Athens, the Temple of Apollo at Delphi, and the Lion Gate at Mycenae. Athens provides students the opportunity to visit ancient ruins surrounded by a vibrant, modern city. Delphi is one of the most beautiful sites in the world, set on the slopes of Mount Parnassus. From the ruins of the Oracle's Temple, students see the breathtaking Gulf of Corinth. Students walk through the ruined fortress walls of the city in Mycenae, the home of Agamemnon, built over 3000 years ago.

Students can enroll in one of four courses (3 credit hours) and add one credit for the study abroad experience. Overload tuition for this 1 credit is waived. The study abroad will take place in May.
